

Applied Design Skills and Technology 7 EBUS Academy

Course Overview:

The Course:

Applied Design Skills and Technology 7 (ADST 7) requires students to complete four units, approximately one per term. Usually, each unit begins with instruction specific to the unit topic, followed by a guided mini project. The mini projects illustrate the process required to be successful with the major project. Students are asked to follow the process with limited to no support, to demonstrate their understanding of the process. The emphasis is not on the end product, but the steps required to get to the end product. The final unit is a project of choice. Students can revisit previous topics to create a more complex version or pick a totally new topic (subject to teacher approval).

The purpose of this course is not to teach specific skills like programming or sewing, but to have students understand what skills they will need to develop and how to find resources to help them learn the skills. To begin to become self-learners and enable lifelong learning.

Course Materials:

There is no textbook for this course.

Content is provided on moodle with links to internet sources where needed.

Testing/Assessment information:

This is a project-based course. Assignments will be assigned based on required project content. Each stage of the process will require that previous stages be submitted and marked before submission is allowed.

There will be short quizzes to ensure video content is understood.

Each project will be grade upon a project rubric.

There will be no tests for this course.

About each Term:

The course is designed to allow for flexibility in execution. What that means is the desired project has a specific generic goal, but the student can decide within that goal how they wish to accomplish the task. Students will want to pace themselves to ensure completion by the final submission date for each term.
