Course Overview

Communications 11 best suits students who ae looking for a course to study the practical use of English rather than the artistic use. It is important to note, that Communications 12 does not qualify the student for entry to universities.

The types of assignments for this course are similar to those in English 11, but with an adapted level of reading and writing assignments. You'll read newspaper articles, folk tales, poetry, short stories as well as write a persuasive essay.

When students are not meeting the learning outcomes/falling behind
